A Proclemation for "Fire Prevention Week in Minnesota"

- THERDAS, the President of the United States has designated the week beginning October 7 as Fire Prevention Week; and
- WHEREAS, preventable fires took a frightful toll of human life and property in Minnesota last year, resulting in tragic death for persons and the destruction of homes, businesses and other property worth more than ten million dollars; and
- WHEREAS, in this oruntal period of history, it is imperative that we keep ourselves strong in menpower, productive facilities and material resources; and
- THEREAS, research into the cause of fires gives evidence that most of these catastrophes can be attributed to only one factor and that is human carelessness;

NOW, THEREFORE, I. C. ELWER ANDERSON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 7 through 14, 1951, as

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK IN MINUESOTA

and call upon every citizen to assume his individual responsibility in eliminating all possible causes of fire in the home and business. I invite all local governments, industry and labor organizations, the churches and schools, civic groups and agencies of the press and radio to join in the observance of this week and direct all appropriate agencies of state government to likewise assist in arousing the public to the growing threat of fires.
