A Proclamation of "Grandmother's Day in Minnesota"

WHEREAS, The National Federation of Grandmother's Clubs is a worthy organization, dedicated to the glorification of Grandmotherhood in America, to the encouragement of research on children's diseases, and to the promotion of better radio programs, better films, better schools and better recreational facilities for the children of the nation; and

WHEREAS, the grandmothers of Minnesota, who have already devoted so much of their lives to the State and its citizens by helping to raise the present generation; and

WHEREAS, those of the present generation should be grateful for the help and encouragement given it by our grandmothers;

IT IS THEREFORE, I, G. Elmer Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim Sunday, October 18, 1953, as

"GRANDMOTHER'S DAY IN MINNESOTA"

and do urge the people of this state to recognize and be grateful for the efforts of Minnesota's grandmothers to make this state and nation a better place in which to live.
