BE IT FURTHER RESCRIPTO, that the Village of Alice be required to secure a written agreement with the Scranton Iron Lining Company and George L. Burrows, plaintiff in the suit now pedning against the Village of Alice that they will not in any way resist the collection by the Village of Hibbing of the amount of the tax?
