A Proclamation for "Future Homemakers of America Week"

WHEREAS, the Future Homemakers of America is a national organization of junior and senior high school students who are studying home-making; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota now has one hundred and two active chapters of the organization and 3,693 active members; and

WHEREAS, the organization supplements and enriches the homemaking class activities, providing an opportunity for girls to develop initiative in group projects which contribute to the solution of problems important to home life; and

WHEREAS, emphasis on home and family life is one of the distinctive characteristics of this organization; and

WHEREAS, the activities of the Future Homemakers are planned to promote a growing appreciation of the joys and satisfactions of home-making, to emphasize the importance of worthy home membership, to encourage democracy in home and family life, to promote international good will, to foster the development of creative leadership in home and community life, to provide wholesome recreation and to further interest in home economics; and

WHEREAS, the home, which is the basic institution in our way of life, is greatly strengthened by the contributions of this outstanding youth program;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, G. ELMER ANDERSON, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week beginning November 4, 1951, as

"FUTURE HOMEMAKERS OF AMERICA WEEK"

and urge all citizens to take notice of the many contributions of the Future Homemakers of America to our state, and to encourage in every possible way the future growth of this organization.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this Twenty-third day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one and of the state, the ninety-fourth.
