A Proclamation for "Armistice Day"

WHEREAS, World War I came to an end on November 11, 1918 with the signing of the armistice which brought hope for world peace and freedom for men everywhere, and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that the anniversary of this great day should be observed in tribute to the men and women whose unselfish service made the victory of right over might possible, and

WHEREAS, in deep appreciation of the debt owed to those who fought and died to preserve our way of life, the State of Minnesota has set aside November 11 of each year as a legal holiday, and

WHEREAS, Armistice Day this year falls upon Sunday, and it has become the policy to observe important holidays falling on Sunday the succeeding working day;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, C. ELMER ANDERSON, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, November 11, 1951, as Armistice Day and urge all citizens, in gratitude to those who made victory in World War I possible to note Armistice Day appropriately, and where unable to observe the day properly on Sunday, to hold ceremonies and observations in keeping with Armistice Day on Monday, November 12.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this thirteenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, and of the state, the ninety-fourth.
