make known that in furtherance of the relations of friendship  
and of commerce between Norway and the United States  
of America  
and by virtue of the powers vested in me by Royal Order  
I hereby appoint Mr. Olafur Thorvaldsson  
to be Vice-Consul at the Consulate General at all  
with a jurisdiction comprising the entire American continent

and request all authorities concerned that with trust and  
confidence they will render him such assistance as he might  
need in the exercise of his duties and that they will accord  
him all rights and privileges granted vice-consuls of other  
friendly Powers.
