A PROCLAMATION FOR "MINNESOTA CONSERVATION WEEK" AND "ARBOR DAY"

WHEREAS, conservation of the natural resources has been an important and necessary part of the American way of life in Minnesota since Arbor Day was first proclaimed in 1876; and

WHEREAS, the call for conservation has been sounded seventy-five times by 29 governors who have succeeded me; and

WHEREAS, the wealth of materials from the soil, water, forest and mines have enabled our people to develop and build a State with a high standard of living; and

WHEREAS, the products from the natural resources always have been used as judges of prosperity and depression, and in times of peace and war, and, therefore, are the only sound foundation on which to build a secure future; and

WHEREAS, it is highly important that we of this generation who are custodians of these natural resources and the substances they produce do all we can to preserve them through widespread application of conservation practices and continuing vigilance against the forces of greed, destruction, and waste;

I, EUGENE T. E. C. KELLY ANDERSON, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby designate the week of April 27 - May 3, 1952, as

CONSERVATION WEEK

and Friday, May 3d as

ARBOR DAY

and most earnestly urge all citizens as individuals and as members of private agencies and organizations to take an active part and interest in the promotion of conservation activities and to plant the forests and woodlands of the future on this Arbor Day.
