
AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX TO THE VILLAGE OF LONG LAKE, HENNEPIN COUNTY,
MINNESOTA, CERTAIN TERRITORY ABUTTING ON SAID VILLAGE.

The Village Council of the Village of Long Lake, Hennepin County,
Minnesota, ordains as follows:

First: That the hereinafter described tract of un-platted land abutting
on said Village, consisting of less than 200 acres, is so conditioned
as properly to be subjected to village government and that the annexation
of the same to said Village will be to the best interests of said
Village and said land and the owners thereof.

Second: That said following described tract of land situated in the
County of Hennepin and State of Minnesota, be and the same hereby is
declared to be annexed to said Village of Long Lake, to-wit:

Beginning at the north-west corner of government lot two(2)
in section thirty-five(35), township one hundred eighteen(118),
range twenty-three(23), thence south to the center-line of the
Watertown Road; thence south-westerly along said center-line to the
center-line of the Walsh Road; thence south-easterly along said
center-line to the west line of said lot two(2); thence south to the
south-west corner of said lot two(2); thence east seven and twenty-
seven hundredths(7.27) chains; thence north to the north line of
the right of way of the Great Northern Railway Company; thence south-east-
erly along said line to its intersection with the north-westerly line
of the right of way of the Minnesota Western Railway Company; ;
thence north-easterly along said line to the center-line of Trunk
Highway No. 12; thence north-westerly along said center-line to a point
four hundred sixty-four(464) feet west of the east line of government
lot four(4) in said section thirty-five(35); thence north parallel to
said east line to a point three hundred (300) feet north of the south
shore of Long Lake; thence westerly and parallel to the said south shore
of Long Lake, and distant three hundred(300) feet north therefrom, to a
point one thousand (1,000) feet west of the northerly extended east
line of government lot three(3) in said section thirty-five(35); thence

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south parallel to said east line to the center-line of said Trunk Highway No. 12 ;thence westerly along said center-line to the west line of said lot three(3);thence north on said line to the center-line of the Watertown Road ; thence westerly along said center-line to a point four(4) rods west of the center-line of the out-let of said Long Lake ;thence north to a point three hundred(300) feet distant from the south shore of said Long Lake ; thence north-westerly to a point three hundred(300) feet east of the north-east corner of government lot two(2) in section thirty-four(34), township one hundred eighteen(118), range twenty-three(23);thence west to the north-east corner of said lot two(2) ; and thence south-easterly along the shore of said Long Lake to the north-west corner of lot two(2) in said section thirty-five (35).

Third: That the Clerk of said Village shall cause this ordinance to be published once in the official newspaper of said Village and shall file in the office of the Auditor of said Hennepin County a certified copy of this ordinance and shall also file another certified copy of this ordinance in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota ; and that thereupon the annexation shall be complete and said land shall be a part of said Village as effectually as if it had been originally a part thereof.
