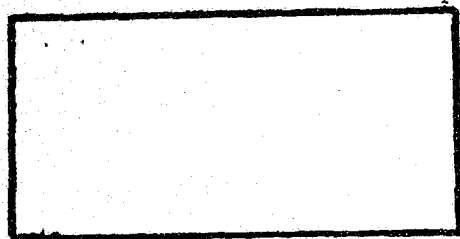
ORDER

WHEREAS, The Honorable Harold Baker, Judge of the District Court of the Twelfth Judicial District of the State of Minnesota, has filed with the undersigned Governor of Minnesota his application for retirement pursuant to authority of Minnesota Statutes 1949, 490.101, 490.102, and it appearing therefrom that he has served and was serving as Judge of the District Court of Minnesota on the effective date of Laws 1949, Chapter 640 (Minnesota Statutes 1949, 490.101, 490.102); that he has attained the age of 70 years; that he has completed fifteen years of service as such judge; that he has made application for retirement from such office within the time required by law after having become eligible; and that by such application he prays the order of the Governor of Minnesota directing his retirement, and it appearing that he is entitled to that retirement under the law;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, C. Elmer Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, in pursuance of the law aforesaid, do hereby order and direct the retirement of Harold Baker aforesaid as Judge of the District Court of the Twelfth Judicial District of the State of Minnesota upon the filing of this order, and I direct that this order be filed in the office of Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota at 12 o'clock noon, on the 24th day of December, 1952, at which time, under the authority of the statute aforesaid, the office of the Judge of the District Court of the Twelfth Judicial District of Minnesota, now held by the Honorable Harold Baker, will become vacant.

**ORDINANCE NO. 5A
ANNEXING CERTAIN TERRITORY
TO THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF
THE VILLAGE OF KENSINGTON,
MINNESOTA**

**THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE
VILLAGE OF KENSINGTON, MIN-
NESOTA DO ORDAIN:**

SECTION I. The corporate limits of the village of Kensington, Minnesota shall be extended to include and encompass the land and territory hereinafter described in Section II hereof, all of which land and territory are now owned by Melford Hagen and Ann Hagen, husband and wife, and lying immediately adjacent to and abutting the Village of Kensington, Minnesota, which owners have petitioned that the same be included in the corporate limits of said Village and annexed thereto.

SECTION II. The land and territory referred to in Section I are described as follows:

A tract and parcel of land lying in the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Twenty-seven (27), Township One Hundred Twenty-seven (127), Range Forty (40) West of the 5th P.M., Douglas County, Minnesota, to-wit: Commencing at a point which is Thirty-three (33) feet due East of the Southwest corner of the said Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$), then from this point as the point of beginning, East Two Hundred Thirty-nine (239) feet; thence North 54 degrees 28' West Seventeen and Sixteen hundredths (17.16) feet; thence North One Hundred Fifty (150) feet; thence West Two Hundred Twenty-five (225.0) feet; thence South One Hundred Sixty (160.0) feet to the point of beginning and containing 0.33 acres more or less.

SECTION III. All of said land and territory by limits, descriptions and bounds in Section II above are hereby annexed to and made a part of the corporate limits of the Village of Kensington, Minnesota.

SECTION IV. This Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with law.
