


KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, J. A. A. Burnquist, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute, and particularly by authority of Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 8.02, do hereby constitute and appoint John H. Burwell of Minneapolis, Minnesota, as Assistant Attorney General for the Department of Conservation, for the period commencing January 5, 1953, and to serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General, or until this commission shall be revoked or otherwise terminated in accordance with law; and, on the recommendation of said department, I hereby fix the compensation of said John H. Burwell as such Assistant Attorney General for the Department of Conservation in the amount now or hereafter fixed by statute for Assistant Attorneys General to be paid from the appropriations made for the Department of Conservation.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand at St. Paul, Minnesota, this 27th day of December, 1952.




