That at the time and place specified in the Notice of said election duly issued by the said County Board on the date last above mentioned, to wit:- in the West side of the one story frame store building occupied by Brown & Mather, and situated on Lot Twenty-eight (28) of Block Three (3) in the original plat of Riverton, Crow Wing County, Minnesota, according to the plat thereof on file and of record in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for said Crow Wing County, Minnesota, said place being within the limits of the proposed village of Riverton, as shown by the petition for such election on the 24th day of December, A. 
