MINUTES OF SPECIAL ELECTION.

(a) The lines following the letter (a) in this blank are left to write in the fact, that "the electors present at the time and place named for opening the polls, elected the judges viva voce, because the Council had neglected to make such appointment," or "because the persons so appointed neglected or refused to serve" (if such was the case).

At a Special Election of the Village of *Willow River* in the County of *Pine* and State of Minnesota, held at *the Village Hall* being the place where it was directed to be held by the Village Council after giving due notice thereof as provided by law, on the *9th* day of *Feb* 18*94*, *Martin J. Thompson* and *S. L. Mattie* two qualified voters of said village, who had within twenty days before such time, been designated and appointed by the Village Council to act as Judges of such Election, (a) *Martin J. Thompson & S. L. Mattie*

who being present with the Recorder at the hour of *9* o'clock *A.* M., each of them duly took and subscribed an oath to faithfully discharge the duties required of them at such election, and the said Judges and Clerk being duly qualified, forthwith opened the polls by proclamation and the election proceeded by ballot without adjournment or intermission until closed.

The subjects voted on at such election, as stated in the Notice thereof, were:

To vote on the proposition to detach from the Village of Willow River all of the east half of Section Three Town 49 Range 20 comprising of the Auditor's Subdivision lots 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9.

At *5th* o'clock in the afternoon of said day the polls were closed, proclamation thereof having been made by one of the Judges thirty minutes previous thereto. The Judges then proceeded to publicly count and canvass the votes, and continued without intermission until complete and the result declared.

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
