WE DO HEREBY CERTIFY, and Return that at a special election held in the town hall in said village of Bruno in the county of Pine and state of Minnesota, on the 3rd day of March, A.D. 1914, to vote on the following question:

"Shall the following described unplatted lands and territory to-wit: West half of West half, ($W\frac{1}{2}$ of $W\frac{1}{2}$) of section twenty (20), West half of West half ($W\frac{1}{2}$ of $W\frac{1}{2}$) of section twenty nine (29), all of section thirty (30), North half of North half ($N\frac{1}{2}$ of $N\frac{1}{2}$) of section thirtyone (31), and Northwest quarter of Northwest quarter ($NW\frac{1}{4}$ of $N\frac{1}{2}$) of section thirty-two (32), all in township forty-four (44) and Tenth Range Eighteen (18), and all of sections twenty-four (24) and twenty-five (25), and the North half of North half ($N\frac{1}{2}$ of $N\frac{1}{2}$) of section thirty-six (36), all in township forty-four (44), Range nineteen (19) within the village of Bruno, be detached from the village",
