A Proclamation for "Youth Week"

WHEREAS, in this time of world uncertainty and crisis it is desirable to encourage all efforts to help bridge the gaps that separate men and to contribute toward the enrichment of the lives of all mankind; and

WHEREAS, youth should be encouraged to strengthen the unity of our nation through worship, study and fellowship; and should be given an opportunity to exhibit through personal living and cooperative action their responsibility for efforts toward the achievement of these goals; and


WHEREAS, the United Christian Youth Movement, in cooperation with the Minnesota Christian Youth Council and the Minnesota Council of Churches, is sponsoring a Youth Week as a part of its program to encourage youth to work toward these goals;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota do proclaim the week of January 30 through February 6, 1955, as

"YOUTH WEEK"

and do urge that during this week increased attention be paid toward understanding and promoting the role of young people in meeting their responsibility toward material and spiritual enrichment of the lives of all people regardless of cultural, creedal, national or racial barriers.
