A Declaration for National Service Week

our state; and

about the great future toward which we all aspire; and

WHEREAS, this year marks the fifth anniversary of the National
Association of the Future Farmers of America, an organization
that composed of boys who are studying vocational
agriculture in public secondary schools as preparation
for careers in farming; and

WHEREAS, the Future Farmers of America helps to teach sound methods
of farming, develops leadership and grants good citizenship
among the farmers, and are thereby encouraged to perform
valuable community services and to contribute especially
toward the development of our agricultural country and the
building of a better state;

I, WILLIAM L. FREEMAN, Governor of the State of
Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of January 27th, 1955, as
