LEGISLATIVE MESSAGE

Recommendation for "Youth Appearance Education Week"

WE BELIEVE, the future of our state and nation lies in the hands of the youth of today, and, therefore, one of our greatest obligations is to help in developing in today's young people the qualities that will enable them to make the most of their future; and

WE BELIEVE, qualities of respect, respect for law, and a high sense of responsibility for the common welfare are essential qualities for the maintenance and development of healthy, happy and successful human lives and a high degree of social progress; and

WE BELIEVE, civic, educational, religious, social and other organizations can and do make a substantial contribution to the development of high moral, spiritual and social standards by provision of appearance education for youth;

WE, therefore, I, Willis L. Benson, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of April 24-30, 1955, as

"Youth Appearance Education Week"

and urge that all citizens give cordial cooperation and support to the strengthening in youth of these moral qualities of respect and responsibility which are so important to the future of our civilization.
