A Proclamation for "Religious Emphasis Week"

- WHEREAS, a deep regard for spiritual values and a sincere belief in the universal religious ideal of the brotherhood of man have been values that have from the beginning contributed immeasurably to the greatness of the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the application of the highest principles of religious faith can contribute greatly to the solution of the pressing social problems and political crises of today, and to the development of happy and constructive individual and family living; and
- WHEREAS, the Minnesota Federation of Women's Clubs is furthering special programs for the week of April 3 to 10, to emphasize the paramount importance of religious observance in cooperation with people of all faiths;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 3-10, 1955, as

"RELIGIOUS EMPHASIS WEEK"

and urge all the people of Minnesota to give particular attention to the observance of religious and spiritual values, each according to his own faith, and, thus, contribute toward deepening the spiritual life and advancing moral and religious ideals in our state, our nation, and the world.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-eighth day of March in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-five and of the state, the ninety-seventh.
