By virtue of the authority vested in my office by Laws 1955, Chapter 320, I designate and appoint Charles E. Houston solicitor general in the office of attorney general, to perform such duties in the place of the attorney general as may be from time to time assigned to him. He shall have the powers of an assistant attorney general and in addition thereto shall supervise all litigation and assign attorneys to conduct both civil and criminal cases for the office of attorney general, except that conducted under the authority of the staff assigned to the Department of Highways. His compensation is fixed at the sum of nine thousand two hundred and seventy-five dollars (\$9,275) per annum.
