EXECUTIVE ORDINANCE

1. Proclamation for "Minnesota History Week"

WHEREAS, the history of Minnesota reveals the problems and the struggles, the accomplishments and the contributions, which the pioneers, the leaders, and the people of our state have made; and

WHEREAS, the advantages, opportunities and freedoms which we enjoy today are the results of the efforts and achievements of our predecessors; and

WHEREAS, a knowledge of these accomplishments develops a deep feeling of sincere patriotism, a desire to honor our forebears, and an incentive to advance the principles and ideals for which they stood; and

WHEREAS, an awareness and understanding of events of the past is an essential part of our approach to the solution of problems of the present and of the future;

BEFORE ME, ARTHUR L. BRUMBY, I, Cecil E. Brumbaugh, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week beginning May 8, 1955, as

"Minnesota History Week"

and urge public, civic and other bodies and all interested citizens to observe that week in such a manner as to honor our pioneers and to recognize the value of the accomplishments of the past as a foundation on which to go forward to an even greater future.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-five of the state the ninety-seventh.
