A Proclamation for "Public Servants Week"

WHEREAS, thousands of people in Minnesota and millions throughout the United States are engaged in serving the public in positions with units of government on the local, state and federal levels; and

WHEREAS, the orderly functioning of our complicated political, social and economic life of today could not continue if it were not for the ability, loyalty, industry and competence of these public employees; and

WHEREAS, the week of June 5 to June 11, 1955, has been designated Public Servants Week in order that special attention might be given to the numerous functions of public service and to stimulate public interest in the well being of public employees;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim June 5 to June 11 as

"PUBLIC SERVANTS WEEK"

and urge that special note be made of the invaluable services performed by public employees, of their importance in our society, and of the contributions which they make toward better communities, a happier and more prosperous state, and a greater nation.
