KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that I, MILES LORD, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute, and including Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 8.06, do hereby constitute and appoint

HARRY H. MacLAUGHLIN

of St. Paul, Minnesota, to be an Investigator for the Attorney General for the following purposes:

To carry out such assignments as are made by the Attorney General to attempt to eliminate restrictions relating to the sale of milk and other dairy products. The compensation of said Investigator for the Attorney General shall be paid out of appropriations to the Attorney General for services performed in matters relating to eliminating restrictions to the sale of milk and other dairy products. Verified statements shall be submitted not more frequently than twice a month to the Attorney General showing the number of days expended, or fractions of a day expended by said Investigator in the performance of his duties under this appointment, together with a list of work performed for services rendered.

The compensation and the payment of expenses necessarily incurred in the performance of his duties shall continue until otherwise determined, but the salary shall not exceed \$200.00 per month.

Said appointee shall serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General or until his appointment shall be revoked or otherwise terminated in accordance with law.
