"Proclamation for American Yugoslav Day"

- WHEREAS, we wish to show our appreciation for the sacrifices they have made on behalf of our commonwealth;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, ORVILLE L. FREEMAN, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, July 31st, 1955, as

and urge that all citizens of Minnesota recognize the contributions made by Americans of Yugoslav descent and join with them on this celebration day.
