A Proclamation for "Union Label Week"

WHEREAS, the men and women who constitute the organized labor movement contribute substantially to our high standard of living, our superior industrial development and productivity, and the general level of economic stability and prosperity; and

WHEREAS, the efforts of organized labor to achieve increased purchasing power and economic and social gains have resulted in benefits to all of our people; and

WHEREAS, the purchase of Union Label goods and the patronage of services designated by Union Shop Cards and Union Buttons by an ever increasing number of our people are actions which, by encouraging the maintenance and improvement of our high standard of living and desirable working conditions, tend to insure a health economy for all;

NOT, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the period of September 5 through September 11, 1955, as

"UNION LABEL WEEK"

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to recognize the contributions made by organized labor to our society by patronizing stores and shops that feature the union emblem and by giving attention to Union Label merchandise displayed and featured.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this thirty-first day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-five and of the state, the ninety-eighth.
