A Proclamation for "United Nations Day"

and

"United Nations Week"

WHEREAS, the aims and objectives of the United Nations and its affiliated organizations are directed toward the maintenance of peace and toward the elimination of conditions and situations that contribute to the causes of war; and

WHEREAS, support of the United Nations and participation in its activities is a fundamental part of the foreign policy of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, at this time, marking the tenth anniversary of the founding of the United Nations, American citizens at the invitation of the President of the United States are engaged in an observance of that anniversary by reviewing the accomplishments and the problems of its first ten years;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 24, 1955, as

"UNITED NATIONS DAY"

and the week of October 23 - October 29, 1955, as

"UNITED NATIONS WEEK"

and invite all Minnesotans to give special attention to the program, the problems and the accomplishments of the United Nations, in recognition of the fact that understanding of world problems on the part of the citizens of the United States is essential to our effective leadership in the free world.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twentieth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-five and of the State, the ninety-eighth.
