What is Amendment 3??
 To The Voters of Eveleth:
 Amendment No. 3 to the Charter proposes that we change our City Officers and our expenses that will be incurred during their terms of office. All expenses of our Officers are presently paid for some members of the City Council in their expense statements. It is our belief that additional expenses may be incurred that will not be covered by the present expense account. The State has estimated these expenses and provided that the following sum be paid annually to cover them:

Mayor	\$100 per year
Councilman	\$100 per year

Amendment No. 3 proposes that in the future, members of our City Government will be supported by their own funds for their term of office. We believe that it is our duty to present to you this proposal for your vote on Amendment No. 3 at the General Election on Tuesday, November 8, 1955.

THE CHARTER COMMISSION

NOTICE

To The People of Eveleth:

It is the intention of the More Hospital Corporation to discontinue operation on December 31, 1955; for the following reasons:

1. The hospital is now operating as a great liability risk since it has been declared unsafe by the state fire marshal for use as an acute hospital.
2. The hospital has been operated for many years at a considerable financial loss, and has been subsidized by the physicians who have owned and operated it.

Furthermore, the present owners do not wish to sell the hospital building to any party for its continued operation as an acute hospital for the following reasons:

1. To make the building safely operable and reasonably free of fire hazard would entail an expenditure of approximately fifty thousand dollars.
2. It is not possible to operate a hospital of this size and type profitably as an acute hospital.
3. Since the continued operation of this hospital would necessarily be temporary, the above initial and operational loss would detract substantially from the funds available for the construction of a new hospital for the city of Eveleth.

The above decision was made by the directors of the East Range Corporation at a special meeting Tuesday, October 25, 1955.

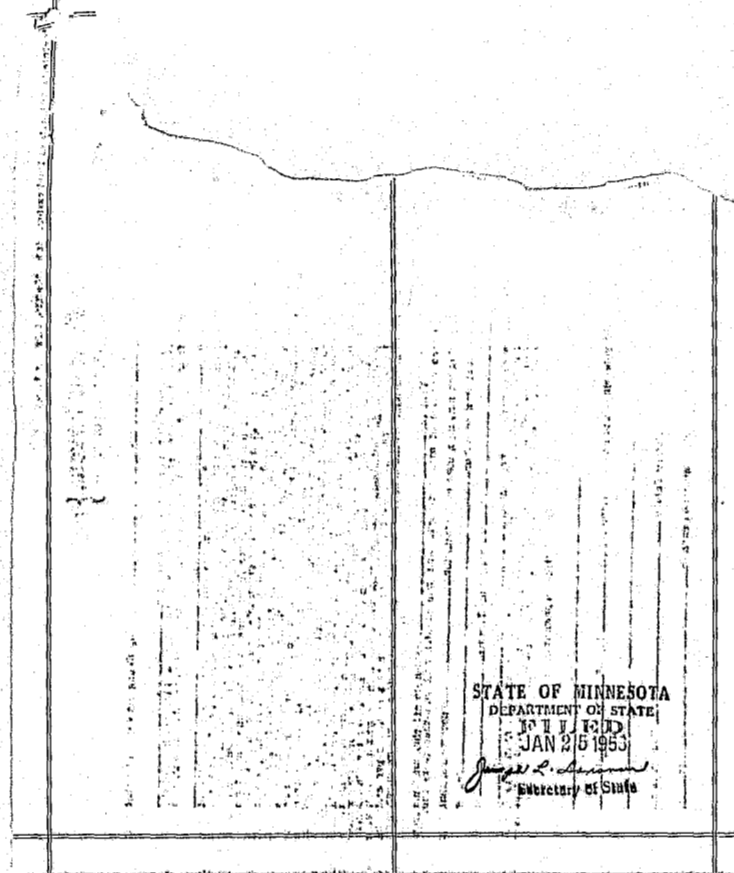
