NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 8 to April 14, 1939, as

"MADE IN MINNESOTA" Week

and urge each individual and community in Minnesota to participate in the celebration of this week with particular emphasis upon the display of the thousands of Minnesota products exhibited in the Junior Chamber of Commerce Exposition held in the Minneapolis Auditorium April 11 - 15th, inclusive.
