We, Joseph L. Donovan, Secretary of State, Leroy E. Matson, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, William P. Murphy, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Ronald E. Hachey, Judge of the District Court, Second Judicial District, and D. E. LaBelle, Judge of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting State Canvassing Board, as required by law, opened and canvassed on April 3rd, 1956, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the March 20, 1956 Presidential Primary Election, and we have prepared therefrom a statement of the whole number of votes cast at said election for the Democratic-Farmer-Labor Party candidates and the Republican Party candidates, expressing the choice of voters for nomination of their respective parties for President of the United States, and delegates to their National Party Conventions, including write-in and sticker votes classified herein as miscellaneous, and we have specified the names of the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each in the several counties in which they were cast, which statement is as follows:
