
NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of April 22 to 28, 1956,




and urge the people of Minnesota to give special attention to the Reserve program, and to the contributions it can make to the young men of our nation and to the strength and security of the United States.
