A Proclamation for "Medical Education Week"

- WHEREAS, the science of medicine has made magnificent strides in improving the health and this progress has been made possible only through the intensive study and research of the medical scientists and teachers; and
- WHEREAS, the need to train sufficient doctors to translate modern medical miracles into everyday benefits for all becomes greater with each significant medical advance; and
- WHEREAS, the level of education, the number of doctors we graduate and the continuing advances in scientific research depend on our sustaining and constant support of the nation's eighty-one medical schools, one of which is our own University of Minnesota Medical School; and
- WHEREAS, we wish to state our support of the medical scientists, educators and the physicians of today and tomorrow;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of April 22 - 28, 1956, as

"MEDICAL EDUCATION WEEK"

and urge all Minnesota citizens to call to mind the benefits which medical science has achieved and will continue to achieve, with our understanding and support.
