A Proclamation for "Clean-up Week in Minnesota"

WHEREAS, in order that we may fully enjoy the summer amid the many natural resources Minnesota has to offer us, it is essential that we unite in ridding our community environments of the drab and the offensive;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 14 - 19, 1956 as

"CLEAN-UP WEEK IN MINNESOTA"

and urge all citizens to cooperate in these programs designed to keep Minnesota attractive, clean and enjoyable.
