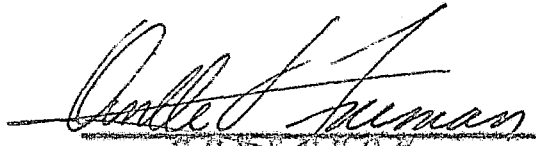

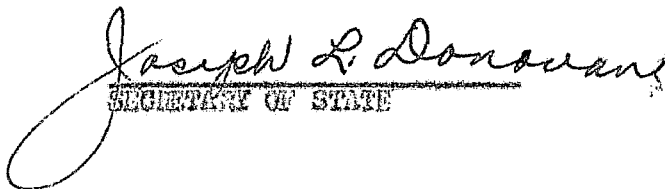

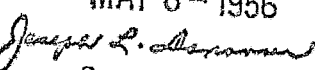
and do urge all citizens of this state to become familiar with the valuable work of The Salvation Army in our state so that they can help to extend its usefulness to all who are in need.
