WHEREAS, the City of Hope National Medical and Research Center provides such high standards of care and treatment on a free and non-sectarian basis;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim June, 1956, as


"CITY OF HOPE SUZAN BALL MONTH"
