WHEREAS, cooperative associations in Minnesota in many fields provide for the processing and marketing of agricultural products and for the purchase of goods and services by consumers; and have contributed substantially to progress in agriculture and to the general economic development which benefits all people in Minnesota;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of October, 1956, as
