

**Ordinance Annexing Unplatted  
Land Not Exceeding 200 Acres  
in Area**

**Ordinance No. 47**

**An Ordinance Extending the Corporate Limits of the Village of Maple Plain, Minnesota, to include Certain Unplatted Land Not Exceeding 200 Acres in Area.**

WHEREAS, a certain petition dated June 29, 1956, and signed by all the owners of the land hereinafter described, requesting annexation of the territory described below was duly presented to the Council on the 25th day of July, 1956.

The Council of the Village of Maple Plain ordains:

**Section 1. Declaration.** It is hereby determined that the territory described below abuts upon the Village and is so conditioned as properly to be subjected to Village government.

**Section 2. Territory Annexed.** The corporate limits of the Village are hereby extended to include the territory lying and being in the County of Hennepin, State of Minnesota, and described as follows:

Commencing at the intersection of the Southerly right-of-way line of the Great Northern Railway and the West line of the East One-half (E ½) of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of Section Twenty-five (25), Township One Hundred Eighteen (118), Range Twenty-four (24); thence South along said West line a distance of 450.5 feet to a point; thence East and parallel to the South line of said Section to a point distant one (1) rod measured at right angles from the Southwesterly line of said Railroad right-of-way; thence Southeasterly and parallel with said right-of-way line to the East line of Section 25; thence North along said East line to the Southerly line of said right-of-way; thence Northwesterly along said right-of-way line to point of beginning.

**Section 3. Filing.** The Village Clerk is hereby directed to file certified copies of this Ordinance in the office of the Secretary of State and in the office of the County Auditor of Hennepin County.

**Section 4. Effective Date of Annexation.** Annexation shall be complete from and after the date when certified copies of this Ordinance have been filed as directed in Section 3.
