WHEREAS, to protect the advantages we have enjoyed, it is necessary for each and every American to acquaint himself with the issues at stake in each election and with the background and ability of the candidates seeking his support so that he may vote intelligently and well; and

WHEREAS, The American Heritage Foundation has, since 1947, dedicated itself to the task of arousing Americans to the keen interest and knowledge necessary in order that they may actively participate in the affairs of government; and

WHEREAS, again this year the Foundation is sparking a nation-wide, non-partisan campaign to induce people to inform themselves on the issues at stake and then cast their ballots in the general election;



and urge Minnesota's citizens to prepare themselves for the election following this week and then cast their ballots for the candidates and parties of their choice.


