AMENDMENT NO. 1

Subdivision Fifty-ninth of Section 8 of Chapter IV of the existing City Charter is hereby amended to read as follows:-

PUBLIC PLAYGROUNDS.

To provide and maintain public parks, public playgrounds and places of recreation for children and adults and to levy the necessary tax to acquire and support the same not exceeding in any one year four (4) mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of the taxable property in the City computed according to law, and this is to be classified as a general fund purpose subject to General Fund limitations as set forth in Section 3 of Chapter V of said Charter.

AMENDMENT NO. 2

That Chapter V of the existing City Charter be amended to include therein Section 18 to read as follows:

AUDIT OF CITY BOOKS.

Section 18. Biennially hereafter the Common Council of the City of West St. Paul shall request the State Public Examiner to examine the books, records, accounts and affairs of said city and report to said Council the condition thereof in writing.

AMENDMENT NO. 3

Section 2 of Chapter II of the existing City Charter is hereby amended to read as follows:

OFFICERS TO BE ELECTED.

At each general city election beginning in the year 1956, there shall be elected a Mayor, City Justice of the Peace, one Constable and a Common Council composed of six Aldermen consisting of two (2) Aldermen from each ward.

All other officers necessary for the proper management of the affairs of said city, and not otherwise provided for in this charter, shall be appointed by the Common Council for a term co-extensive with the life of said Common Council.
