A Proclamation for "Farm-City Week"

WHEREAS, each citizen of Minnesota realizes every day as he works and lives in the community, the friendly support given by our farmers to the enterprises of the city and the dependence of our rural people upon the successful and prosperous operation of our Minnesota farms; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that we call to mind this interdependence of our people, one upon the other, so that we may recognize its importance in continuing the building of a healthy and growing Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota-Dakotas District of Kiwanis International will join together the various farm, civic, industrial and labor organizations in a celebration of Farm-City Week and in programs throughout our state, designed to bring together these local leaders to continue the fine understanding which has been developed between them;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of November 16 - 22, 1956 as

FARM-CITY WEEK IN MINNESOTA

and urge all Minnesotans to note and support the programs being sponsored in connection therewith.


