OF THE GENERAL ELECTION
NOVEMBER 6, 1956.

WE, JOSEPH L. DONOVAN, SECRETARY OF STATE, ROGER L. DELL, CHIEF JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT, FRANK T. GALLAGHER, ASSOCIATE JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT, JAMES C. OTIS, JUDGE OF DISTRICT COURT, SECOND JUDICIAL DISTRICT, AND PAUL S. CARROLL, JUDGE OF DISTRICT COURT, FOURTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT, THE LEGALLY CONSTITUTED AND ACTING STATE CANVASSING BOARD, AS REQUIRED BY LAW, OPENED AND CANVASSED ON NOVEMBER 20, 1956, THE CERTIFIED COPIES OF THE STATEMENTS MADE BY THE COUNTY CANVASSING BOARDS OF THE VOTES CAST AT THE NOVEMBER 6, 1956 GENERAL ELECTION, AND WE HAVE PREPARED THEREFROM A STATEMENT OF THE WHOLE NUMBER OF VOTES CAST AT SAID ELECTION FOR AND AGAINST THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, FOR PRESIDENTIAL ELECTORS, THE SEVERAL STATE OFFICERS, ASSOCIATE JUSTICES OF THE SUPREME COURT, REPRESENTATIVES IN THE LEGISLATURE FROM SUCH DISTRICTS AS ARE REQUIRED BY LAW TO BE CERTIFIED BY THIS BOARD, REPRESENTATIVES IN CONGRESS, JUDGES OF DISTRICT COURT, AND CLERK OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION, SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 6, ITASCA COUNTY, AND WE HAVE SPECIFIED THE PERSONS RECEIVING SUCH VOTES AND THE NUMBER RECEIVED BY EACH, WHICH STATEMENT IS AS FOLLOWS:

REORGANIZATION OF STATE JUDICIAL SYSTEM

Shall Article VI of the Constitution of the State of Minnesota relating to the judicial power of the state be amended to organize, establish, conduct, and operate the judicial power of the State of Minnesota in accordance with the provisions of the amendment printed and published in Laws 1955, Chapter 881?

CONSOLIDATED ARTICLE ON PUBLIC HIGHWAYS

Shall the Constitution of the State of Minnesota be amended by including a consolidated article on public highways, establishing and continuing the trunk highway system which is to be constructed and maintained by the state, authorizing the issuance of bonds for trunk highway purposes; authorizing the state to aid in the construction and maintenance of other public highways; authorizing the taxation of motor vehicles and the levying of an excise tax on motor fuel to create a fund for highway purposes, and apportioning the moneys in said fund for highway purposes as follows: 62 percent to the trunk highway fund, 29 percent to the county state-aid highway fund, and nine percent to the municipal state-aid street fund?

Funds derived from the tax herein provided for shall be used as follows: 50 percent to the state general revenue fund, 40 percent to a fund for the support of elementary and secondary schools, and ten percent for the general support of the university?
