A Proclamation for "Pearl Harbor Day"

WHEREAS, Friday, December 7, marks the fifteenth anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor, Hawaii which plunged the people of this state and the United States into World War II; and

WHEREAS, a day set aside by this state for special observance of this anniversary could accomplish great good in obtaining recognition of the ever present need for national preparedness and in fostering the values of courage and will to victory uncovered by Pearl Harbor in 1941;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Friday, December 7, 1956 as

PEARL HARBOR DAY

and urge Minnesotans to make suitable observance of this important day in the history of our nation.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fifth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-six and of the state, the ninety-ninth.
