ORDINANCE# 43
AN ORDINANCE TO EXTEND THE
BOUNDARIES OF YOUNG AMERICA
AND INCORPORATE ADDITIONAL
TERRITORY THEREIN.

The Village Council of the Village of Young America, Minn. do
Ordain:

Section 1. - Village Boundary Extended:

Pursuant to a petition duly signed by Merlin J. Debner and Betty M. Debner, husband and wife, and Ferdinand Bleunke and Laura Bleunke, husband and wife, the owners of the land described as follows, to-wit:

1. - The tract owned by Merlin J. Debner and Betty M. Debner -

Commencing at a point 33 feet South of the Quarter Section corner between Sections 11 and 14, Township 115 Range 26, said point being on the South boundary line of State Road #5, of said Carver County, as there laid out and constructed; thence South on the Quarter Section line 168 feet; thence West 60 feet; thence Northwest 80 feet more or less, to an intersection with a 2°20' curve which is the South boundary line of said State Road aforesaid, which said point is a distance of 158 feet from the point of beginning; thence in a Northeasterly direction along said boundary line, 158 feet to the place of beginning, containing 31/100ths acre, more or less and being situated in the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 14 Township 115 Range 26.

2. - The tract owned by Ferdinand Bleunke and Laura Bleunke, husband and wife,-

Commencing at a point 33 feet South of the Quarter Section corner between Sections 11 and 14, Township 115 Range 26; said point being on the South boundary line of State Road #5, of said Carver County, as there laid out and constructed; thence South on the Quarter Section line 243 feet; thence West 260 feet to an intersection with a 2°20' curve, which is the South boundary line of said State Road aforesaid; thence in a Northeasterly direction along said boundary line, 356 feet to the place of beginning excepting however, the following described tract to-wit:

Commencing at a point 33 feet South of the Quarter Section corner between Sections 11 and 14, Township 115 Range 26; said point being on the South boundary line of State Road #5, of said Carver County, as there laid out and constructed; thence South on a quarter Section line 168 feet; thence West 60 feet; thence Northwest 80 feet more or less, to an intersection with 2°20' curve which is the South boundary line of said State Road aforesaid and which point is a distance of 158 feet from the point of beginning of this exception; thence in a Northeasterly direction along said boundary line, 158 feet to the point of beginning, containing 31/100ths acre, more or less.

Lying and being in the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 14 Township 115 Range 26 and containing 40/100ths acre, more or less.

the territorial limits of the Village of Young America are hereby extended

to include such lands within its limits, which shall hereafter be governed as other territory of the Village is governed.
