A Proclamation for "Alien Address Report" Month

- WHEREAS, the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952 requires that every alien in the United States, except representatives of a foreign government and contract laborers from Mexico, report his address during January of such year; and
- WHEREAS, this law requires such an address report though the address of the alien has not changed since the last address report; and
- WHEREAS, Address Report Cards may now be obtained at any United States Post Office or Immigration Service office within this state,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, in recognition of the importance of compliance with the law to future citizens of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the month of January, 1957, as

ALIEN ADDRESS REPORT MONTH

in Minnesota and request all citizens, employees, and officers of the State of Minnesota to assist and encourage every alien within the State to report his address at the nearest post office or Immigration Service office during the month of January, 1957.
