

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT made and entered into this 10th
day of July, A.D. 1914, by and between Theodore R. Willverscheid,
of St. Paul, Minnesota, party of the first part, and the Secretary
of State, State Treasurer and State Auditor of the State of
Minnesota, parties of the second part, V I T I E S S E E N:

WHEREAS, there was passed by the Legislature of the
State of Minnesota, in the session of 1911, and approved by the
Governor, an act entitled "An Act defining motor vehicles;
providing for the registration of the same; the licensing of the
drivers thereof; regulating the use and speed of motor-vehicles;
prescribing road rules; fixing the amount of registration and
license fees; prescribing penalties for violations of the pro-
visions of this Act; repealing inconsistent Acts and provisions,
and making an appropriation of money to effectuate the purposes
of the same", and known as Chapter 365 of the General Laws of
Minnesota for the year 1911, which is hereby referred to and
made a part of this agreement; and

WHEREAS pursuant to Section 12¹ of said Act the
Secretary of State duly called for bids ^{for} registration certifi-
cates and tags required in accordance with the provisions of said
act, and under its terms the bid of the party of the first part
was duly accepted by the Secretary of State, State Auditor and
State Treasurer;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants
herein contained to be by each of the parties hereto performed,
said parties hereto agree as follows:-

The party of the first part agrees to furnish to the
Secretary of the State of Minnesota fifty thousand (50,000) sets
of two each, automobile license tags, referred to in the advertise-
ment of the Secretary of State as Class "A" tags; three hundred
(300) sets of two each automobile dealer license tags, referred
to in the advertisement of the Secretary of State as Class "B"
tags; five (5) sets of two each automobile manufacturer's
license tags, referred to in the advertisement of the

Secretary of State as Class "C" tags; in the style, quality, quantity, number and at the times and for the compensation hereinafter set forth:-

1. Said tags to be of aluminum of #24 B & S gauge, to be in size and dimensions and lettering substantially as specified in said Section Ten (10), of said Chapter 365 of the General Laws of Minnesota for 1911.

The numerals and the letters "Minn." on said tags to be in dark red enamel, with a raised outline; the dates 1915, 1916 and 1917, to be raised and the tags to have raised bead around the border, all in conformity with sample marked "3" submitted with the bid of the party of the first part to the Secretary of State, State Treasurer and State Auditor, and retained by them.

2. It is agreed that the deliveries of said automobile tags are to be made as follows: fifteen thousand (15000) sets of automobile license tags October 15th, 1914; fifteen thousand (15000) sets of automobile license tags November 15, 1914; twenty thousand (20000) sets automobile license tags December 15, 1914; the same being designated in the advertisement of the Secretary of State as Class "A" tags; all of the automobile dealer license tags and automobile manufacturer's license tags designated in the advertisement of the Secretary of State as Class "B" and "C" tags, December 15th, 1914; and it is further agreed that said deliveries are to be made at the office of the Secretary of State, at the State Capitol, St. Paul, Minnesota.

3. It is further agreed that the price to be paid by said parties of the second part to said party of the first part for said tags shall be twenty eight cents (.28) for each set of tags, and that payments are to be made out of the funds provided for under the terms of said Chapter 365 of the General Laws of Minnesota for 1911, as the same become available.

4. It is further agreed that each set of two tags is

to be enclosed in an envelope of sufficient weight and quality, said tags to have placed between each set enclosed in such envelope a sheet of paper to prevent damage by rubbing or scratching; the envelopes to be printed in compliance with instructions from the Secretary of State, and to be numbered with the number that the tags enclosed in each envelope bear; the tags so enclosed to be packed in substantial crates in accordance with the directions and instructions of the Secretary of State.

5. It is further agreed that all tags must be finished in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and the right is reserved by the parties of the second part to reject any tags having defective material, lettering or numbering. The said party of the first part further agrees to refinish or replace without expense any tags that fail under ordinary usage during the term of this contract.

6. It is further agreed that the term of this contract shall continue until January 1st, 1910, and that during said period the Secretary of State shall have the right to order and said party of the first part shall furnish additional sets of tags or duplicates for tags, and deliver the same at such times and in such quantities as Secretary of State shall direct, and that the amount to be paid therefor to the party of the first part shall be twenty eight cents (.28) for each set of tags.

7. It is further agreed that the terms, covenants and provisions of this contract shall extend to and be binding upon the heirs, administrators, executors and assigns and the successors in office of the respective parties hereto.


