LEGISLATIVE MESSAGE

Resolution for "Minnesota Health Week"

WHEREAS, one of the major obligations and responsibilities of civilized society, is responsibility which is shared by government, by voluntary organizations, and by other voluntary public organizations, to provide for the needs and the welfare of the people; and particularly to be concerned with those who because of youth, age, or other handicaps or special circumstances, require help in carrying their physical, social and spiritual needs and

WHEREAS, several agencies of government and many private organizations are dedicated to serving the welfare of the people and are carrying out this task through the efforts of professionally trained and skilled personnel and with the assistance of countless local officials and volunteers who give of their time, resources, and ability to contribute to the welfare and happiness of citizens; and

WHEREAS, these agencies and individuals are joined together in the Minnesota Health Conference, which, during the month of April, is holding its thirty-fourth annual meeting to consider common objectives in serving the needs of the people and citizens by which these ends can be met most effectively; and

WHEREAS, it is of utmost importance to the citizens of this state, both public and private, that the people of Minnesota become fully aware of the needs that exist, of the common objectives to meet these needs, of the many agencies, both State and non-State, which are working to carry out an effective program, and of the many values that result from their investments;

BEFORE, WHEREAS, I, Charles L. Johnson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of March 19th to 25, 1957 as

MINNESOTA HEALTH WEEK

and urge all citizens of Minnesota to give particular attention during that week to the problems that exist, to the efforts of our welfare agencies to meet vital health needs and to the results of such efforts in bringing about higher standards of health, of economic development, of social progress, and of human happiness.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven and of the state, the thirty-ninth.
