A Proclamation for "Pax Romana Day"

WHEREAS, The International Movement of Catholic Students, also known as Pax Romana, is composed of Catholic student groups throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, Pax Romana fosters and stimulates many programs of international exchange of ideas, programs and information among its member groups; and

WHEREAS, the activities of Pax Romana are a moving force in obtaining increased understanding between the students of the nations of the world so that as these students take the reins of government and community affairs in their respective countries, they will personally cause of the inherent bond between men of every nation; and

WHEREAS, Pax Romana develops an appreciation of the need for Christian scholarship and a personalized training in Christian action in the students who participate;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the day of March 7, 1957 as

"PAX ROMANA DAY"

and urge all Minnesotans to recognize the benefit to Minnesota, to the nation and to the world being derived from the Pax Romana programs for our future leaders.
