of nations to stand only in part of the spirit which has developed this continent's international cooperation, but as well also to affirm and extend this spirit that in any country further here the international good will and peace, and to that end to our principles, interests, and any efforts to the extent that contribute to such cooperation.

That, therefore, I, Charles L. Johnson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, April 22, 1970, as

and urge that all citizens give special attention to the commitments represented by the organization of western states and to its cooperation of the contributions which such international cooperation has made to the cause of peace in the world.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol, this twentieth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven and of the State the sixteenth.
