A Proclamation for National Engineers Week

- WHEREAS, a major goal of our state and nation is the attainment of a sound domestic economy in time of peace so as to provide full employment, opportunities for initiative and investment and an adequate supply of goods for our citizens; and
- WHEREAS, an equally important goal is the fortifying of our defenses so that our people can live in confident assurance of protection from outside attack; and
- WHEREAS, the chemical industry of our state has made, and increasingly continues to make, substantial contributions to both these goals by manufacturing our such necessary items as our aircraft and
- WHEREAS, because these contributions by the chemical industry have helped our citizens to attain a higher standard of living and have protected us more than any other people on earth

That, therefore, I, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 9 - 15, 1957, as

in Minnesota and urge all citizens to support the celebration of this week in order to point up the importance of the chemical industry in daily life.

and the Independence of the
