A Proclamation for "Good Human Relations Week"

WHEREAS, the foundation of all human progress is the contact daily and weekly between the members of our society in carrying out the necessary business of civilization; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to good human relations in business, industry, education, government and the home, that the inherent worth of each individual be recognized and that consideration be given to the rights and dignity of all human beings; and

WHEREAS, the Dale Carnegie Club International is again sponsoring a "Good Human Relations Week" throughout the United States, Canada, South Africa and other parts of the world;

I, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of April 12th through April 18, 1957, as

GOOD HUMAN RELATIONS WEEK

and urge all citizens to observe this week by recognizing and extending the practice of consideration for the rights of our fellow citizens and by living the fundamentals of good human relations practice not only during this week but throughout the entire year.
