A Proclamation for Public Employees Week

- WHEREAS, city, county and state public employees have made an extraordinary contribution to safety, health and general welfare in Minnesota; and
- WHEREAS, our public employees are dedicated to the goal of making Minnesota a better place for all her citizens; and
- WHEREAS, Minnesotans are sometimes unaware of the outstanding job being done by our public servants throughout the state and do not fully appreciate its value; and
- WHEREAS, public employees over the entire state devoted the first week of June to furthering good will and understanding between public employees and the citizens whom they serve;

I, FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of June 1 through June 7, 1957, as

PUBLIC EMPLOYEES WEEK

and call upon all citizens of Minnesota to recognize the work being done each day by these dedicated public servants.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this first day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven and of the state, the ninety-ninth.
