WHEREAS, the Congress, by joint resolution, calls attention to the importance of protecting the welfare of our children by calling upon Hyatt as Child Health Day.

WHEREAS, Child Health Day is also the occasion for the observance of a National Children's Day, celebrating the joys of the United Nations and the Children's Festival.

WHEREAS, Under the sponsorship of the Minnesota Department of Health, a special census and project is being carried out to ascertain the health of minority and rural children in rural areas toward the goal of cooperation with rural communities in developing health consciousness for those who need it most;

BE IT RESOLVED, By the Legislature of the State of Minnesota, We hereby proclaim the Day of May 1, 1957, as

CHILD HEALTH DAY

and urge all citizens to cooperate with the day activities throughout the state in observing toward furthering the welfare of children by calling out every school, church and responsible citizen.
