A Proclamation for "Multiple Sclerosis Month"

- WHEREAS, multiple sclerosis is the most serious disease of young adults, attacking in the 20 to 40 year age group; and
- WHEREAS, there are more known victims of multiple sclerosis in Minnesota, 6,000 to 7,000 cases, than in any other state in the nation; and
- WHEREAS, there is an urgent need for national research programs that will eventually find a cure for multiple sclerosis; and
- WHEREAS, additional funds are needed to purchase and provide appliances and equipment for multiple sclerosis patients upon recommendation of their own physicians; and
- WHEREAS, funds also are needed to underwrite the salaries of trained homemakers who can go into the homes of multiple sclerosis victims and assume full duties and responsibilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of June as

MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS MONTH

and urge all Minnesotans to respond generously to the fund-raising appeal made this month by the Minnesota Chapters of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society.
